The Registrant was not required by Rule 104 of Regulation BTR to send any notice to any of its directors or executive officers during the fiscal year ended December 31, 2011.

#### Audit Committee Financial Expert

The Board of Directors of the Registrant has determined that each of Gary German, Anthony Griffiths and Andrew Burns, individuals serving on the Audit Committee of the Registrant's Board of Directors, is an audit committee financial expert, within the meaning of General Instruction B(8)(b) of Form 40-F. Each of Messrs. German, Griffiths and Burns is independent, as that term is defined in the rules of the New York Stock Exchange ("NYSE").

The SEC has indicated that the designation of a person as an audit committee financial expert does not make such person an "expert" for any purpose, impose any duties, obligations or liability on such person that are greater than those imposed on members of the Audit Committee and the Board of Directors who do not carry this designation or affect the duties, obligations or liability of any other member of the Audit Committee or Board of Directors.

#### Code Of Ethics

The Registrant has adopted a code of ethics (as that term is defined in Form 40-F) that applies to all of its directors, officers and employees. The code of ethics has been posted to the Registrant's website at [www.jaguarmining.com](http://www.jaguarmining.com).

#### Principal Accountant Fees And Services

The Registrant has paid KPMG, its external auditors, the following fees in each of the last two fiscal periods.

#### ***Audit Fees***

The aggregate fees billed by KPMG for the fiscal years ended December 31, 2011 and December 31, 2010 for professional services rendered by KPMG for the audit of the Registrant's annual financial statements or services that are normally provided by KPMG in connection with statutory and regulatory filings or engagements for such fiscal years were Cdn.\$826,400 and Cdn.\$655,700, respectively.

***Audit-Related Fees***

The aggregate fees billed by KPMG for the fiscal years ended December 31, 2011 and December 31, 2010 for assurance and related services rendered by KPMG that are reasonably related to the performance of the audit or review of the Registrant's financial statements and are not reported above as audit fees were Cdn.\$nil.

***Tax Fees***

The aggregate fees billed by KPMG for the fiscal years ended December 31, 2011 and December 31, 2010 for professional services rendered by KPMG for tax compliance, tax advice, tax planning and other services were Cdn.\$nil and Cdn.\$18,100, respectively.

***All Other Fees***

The aggregate fees billed by KPMG for the fiscal years ended December 31, 2011 and December 31, 2010 for services other than those reported under "Audit Fees", "Audit-Related Fees", and "Tax Fees" were Cdn.\$192,200 and Cdn.\$246,500, respectively. Other provided included advice related to the conversion to IFRS.

***Audit Committee Approval***

The Registrant's audit committee approves every significant engagement by KPMG to render audit or non-audit services. All of the services described above were approved by the audit committee.

#### Off-Balance Sheet Arrangements

The Registrant is not a party to any off-balance sheet arrangements that have or are reasonably likely to have a current or future effect on its financial condition, changes in financial condition, revenues or expenses, results of operations, liquidity, capital expenditures or capital resources that is material to investors.

#### Tabular Disclosure Of Contractual Obligations

The Registrant's contractual obligations as at December 31, 2011 are summarized in its Management's Discussion and Analysis of Financial Condition and Results of Operations for the fiscal year ended December 31, 2011, attached as Exhibit 99.3 hereto, under the heading "***Financial Condition, Cash Flow, Liquidity and Capital Resources – Contractual Obligations***" and are incorporated herein by reference.

#### Identification of Audit Committee

The Registrant has an audit committee comprised of the following three individuals, all of who are independent as that term is defined by the rules of the NYSE: Messrs. Gary German, Anthony Griffiths and Andrew Burns.

#### Critical Accounting Policies

A discussion of the Registrant's critical accounting policies can be found in its Management's Discussion and Analysis of Financial Condition and Results of Operations for the fiscal year ended December 31, 2011, attached as Exhibit 99.2 hereto, under the heading "***Critical Accounting Policies***".

#### Disclosure Required Pursuant to the NYSE

The Registrant is classified as a foreign private issuer under US securities law and its common shares are listed on the NYSE. Pursuant to the rules of the NYSE, a foreign private issuer is permitted, subject to a few exceptions, to follow home country practice in lieu of the corporate governance rules of the NYSE. The only corporate governance practice of the Registrant that differs from those required by the NYSE rules to be followed by U.S. domestic issuers is the quorum found in Section 5.3(c) of the NYSE rules which rule provides that a quorum for any meeting of shareholders



may not consist of less than 33.33% of the common shares issued and outstanding. The Registrant's by-laws require that a quorum for any meeting of shareholders may not consist of less than 15% of the common shares issued and outstanding. This policy is consistent with requirements of the Toronto Stock Exchange and applicable corporate laws in Ontario.

## **UNDERTAKING AND CONSENT TO SERVICE OF PROCESS**

### **A. Undertaking**

The Registrant undertakes to make available, in person or by telephone, representatives to respond to inquiries made by SEC staff, and to furnish promptly, when requested to do so by SEC staff, information relating to the securities in relation to which the obligation to file an annual report on Form 40-F arises or transactions in such securities.

### **B. Consent to Service of Process**

The Registrant has previously filed with the SEC a Form F-X in connection with its common shares.
